Tenure Track Position

The Department of Economics has an opening for a tenure-track position for an Assistant Professor beginning mid-August 2010. The person will be assigned to teach two or three sections of principles of economics courses plus one or two upper level courses per semester (not more than three upper levels per academic year). Average class size is around 30 students. Courses that need to be covered include Public Finance, Economic Development, History of Economic Thought, Labor Economics, and Health Economics. Ability and willingness to teach Econometrics is a plus. Ph.D. is required, but ABD's who expect to complete prior to August 2010 are welcome to apply. Salary and rank are commensurate with qualifications and experience. It is expected that the successful candidate will engage in teaching, scholarly/professional activities, and service to the institution for retention, promotion, tenure, and merit awards.

Opportunity to engage in applied research and community extension activities funded by the Land Grant Institute of the university exists. Proficiency in speech communication and willingness to accommodate the needs of a diverse student body are necessary. Duties include teaching at least one evening class, two nights a week.
