Founded in 1891, West Virginia State University (WVSU) is a public-land grant institution, which was originally founded as a historically black university, but which has evolved into a fully accessible, racially integrated and multi-generational institution serving approximately 3,514 students. The University is a community of students, staff, and faculty committed to academic growth, service and preservation of the racial and cultural diversity of the institution. WVSU offers 23 undergraduate and six graduate degrees through its four colleges. WVSU competes in athletics at the NCAA Division II level in five men's sports and five women's sports. WVSU is located in Institute, WV, a suburb of Charleston, the largest city and the capital of West Virginia. With more than 300,000 people living in the metropolitan area, it is an active, exciting and engaging community, boasting cultural and historical events, music, festivals and entertainment.

Position Description

The Center for Online Learning at West Virginia State University announces a position as Instructional Designer starting in the Fall 2020 semester. The Instructional Designer provides instructional design and multimedia support for faculty developing courses and interactive learning modules. The Center for Online Learning manages the University's Learning Management System, assists faculty with designing online courses, and provides a help desk for both students and faculty. This is a non-classified, non-essential, FLSA exempt, full-time, benefits eligible position.

Responsibilities for the Instructional Designer

The Full Time Instructional Designer must possess the following skills and attributes: strong interpersonal and communication skills; strong technical and professional skills; and organization and management skills.

The Instructional Designer performs the following essential functions:

1. Assist faculty and students in day-to-day functions of Moodle.
2. Assist faculty with designing and developing fully online and hybrid courses.
3. Supervise student workers in LMS support.
4. Review existing fully online and hybrid courses each semester to ensure high quality content and design.
5. Assist faculty with designing ADA accessible courses.
6. Assist with maintenance of departmental files and records, such as responding to help

desk tickets.

7. Assist professors in course content alignment with course objectives and outcomes.
8. Provide assistance to the Director of the Center for Online Learning as needed.
9. Provide new student orientation to Moodle.
10. Create and locate supporting material/media including, but not limited to: videos, audio, visuals, etc.
11. Setup and operation of video recording equipment
12. Create transcripts for all multimedia that contains audio to meet ADA accessibility requirements.
13. Create new student orientation and faculty training materials
14. Develop any other media production as needed by professors, staff, and/or administrators.
15. Other duties as assigned.

Requirements for the Instructional Designer

Master's degree in Education, Curriculum Design, or other field directly related to the area of assignment. Additional qualifying years of experience may be substituted for the required education on a year for year basis

Salary Statement

Salary will be commensurate with education and experience.
